A reading from the book of Wisdom

In the place of sin, you give repentance. There is no god, other than you, who cares for everything, to whom you might have to prove that you never judged unjustly. Your justice has its source in strength, your sovereignty over all makes you lenient to all. You show your strength when your sovereign power is questioned and you expose the insolence of those who know it; but, disposing of such strength, you are mild in judgement, you govern us with great lenience, for you have only to will, and your power is there. By acting thus you have taught a lesson to your people how the virtuous man must be kindly to his fellow men, and you have given your sons the good hope that after sin you will grant repentance.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Let them grow together until the harvest.

Jesus put a parable before the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn."

RITE OF SCRUTINY

Invitation to Silent Prayer

Elect of God, bow your heads (kneel down) and pray.

Intercessions for the Elect

Let us pray for these elect whom the Church has confidently chosen. May they successfully complete their long preparation and find Christ in his sacraments.

That they may ponder the word of God in their hearts and savour its meaning more fully day by day, let us pray to the Lord:

Lord, hear our prayer.

That they may learn to know Christ, who came to save what was lost, let us pray to the Lord: Lord, hear our prayer.

That they may sincerely reject everything in their lives that is displeasing and contrary to Christ, let us pray to the Lord:

Lord, hear our prayer.

That the Holy Spirit, who searches every heart, may help them to overcome their weakness through his power, let us pray to the Lord: Lord, hear our prayer. That their families also may put their hope in Christ and find peace and holiness in him, let us pray to the Lord: Lord, hear our prayer.

That throughout the whole world whatever is weak may be strengthened, whatever is broken restored, whatever is lost found, and what is found redeemed, let us pray to the Lord: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Exorcism

The celebrant faces the elect and, with hands joined, says:

Father of mercy, Grant these elect the wisdom to live in the world as wheat among the darnel. Protect the crop you have sown from the enemy.

Free these elect from the false values that surround and blind them. Set them firmly in your truth, children of the Kingdom of light for ever. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Amen.

Then, with hands outstretched over all the elect, he continues:

Lord Jesus, You gather the wheat at harvest time and bundle the darnel to be burnt.

Stir up the desire for good in these elect, whom you have chosen for your sacraments.

Let them rejoice in your harvest that they may prove to be staunch and fearless witnesses to the faith, and come to the joy of your Kingdom for you are Lord for ever and ever.

Amen.
