That their families also may put their hope in Christ and find peace and holiness in him, let us pray to the Lord:

Lord, hear our prayer.

That throughout the whole world whatever is weak may be strengthened, whatever is broken restored, whatever is lost found, and what is found redeemed, let us pray to the Lord:

Lord, hear our prayer.

Exorcism

Lord God by your grace you have led these Elect to discover the treasure hidden in the field, to find a fine pearly of great value.

Free these elect from the death-dealing power of the spirit of evil, and bring them into your kingdom to share new life in the risen Christ, for he lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Amen.

Then, with hands outstretched over all the elect, he continues:

Lord Jesus, You call us to the rich treasure of faith so that we might have life and have it more abundantly.

Free from the grasp of death those who await your life-giving sacraments and deliver them from the spirit of corruption. Through your Spirit, who gives life, fill them with faith, hope, and charity, that they may live with you always in the glory of your resurrection, for you are Lord for ever and ever.
